The Canadian Street Rodding Hall of Fame (CSRHoF) was created in 1993 to commemorate the 25th Anniversary of the Canadian Street Rod Nationals. At that event held in Moncton, New Brunswick the first 25 members were inducted. Among the Canada wide group were representatives from all facets of the hobby; industry pioneers Bob McJannett and Paul Horton, personalities like Dizzy Dean Murray, automotive journalists Liz Kitzel and Jil MacIntosh were honoured along with a number of grass root rodders like Jim Flett and John Van Dube and companies including BFGoodrich Tires. Since then, at least one new inductee has been honoured each year. In 2008, the Pacific International Street Rod Association of Vancouver, British Columbia was inducted.

Nominations are open for 2009. Any person, group or corporation recognized as having been instrumental in developing street rodding in Canada is eligible to be nominated and anyone can nominate. To be considered, nominations must be received on a fully completed official nomination form along with any supporting material either electronically or via mail by May 15, 2009.

The CSRHoF salutes the accomplishments of this select group of people on an annual basis through public acknowledgement at the Induction Gala. In 2009 the Gala will again take place at the Canadian Legion in Waterdown, Ontario on October 3rd.
